Receivership – Answers to Vendors’ Most Frequently Asked  
Questions**

**If I Have an Outstanding Accounts Payable with Health Care One (“HCO”) or Elite Business Solutions (“Elite”), Will I Get Paid?**

Unfortunately, there is no clear answer to this question as yet.

Both companies have been sued by the Federal Trade Commission which alleges that both engaged in deceptive trade practices in selling their healthcare discount programs. The court entered a Temporary Restraining Order which prohibits them from using any deceptive practices in the future. The Court also froze their bank accounts and funds and appointed a Temporary Receiver who has taken control of their business operations.

The Temporary Receiver has suspended all operations at both HCO and Elite. All employees have been sent home. All sales and nearly all customer service functions have been suspended, and all websites have been deactivated.

Whether or not either company re-opens for business is just not known at this time. Nor is it known whether funds will be available to satisfy outstanding accounts payable.

Over the next several weeks, many of the open questions will be answered and the Temporary Receiver will be able to provide more complete answers to vendors looking for payment.

**What Should I Do Now to Protect My Rights?**

We must caution, however, that the Temporary Restraining Order which appointed the Temporary Receiver contains a “Stay of Actions” provision which prohibits any creditor from bringing suit against HCO or Elite without first getting approval of the United States District Court presiding over the FTC action.
